

## BUSINESS IMPACT ESTIMATE

As required by Sec. 166.041(4), *Florida Statutes* (2024), this “Business Impact Estimate” is provided for Ordinance No. 405

### ORDINANCE NO. 405

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF MANALAPAN, FLORIDA; AMENDING THE TOWN CODE OF ORDINANCES AT CHAPTER 155. BEACHES AND WATERWAYS. SECTION 155.03. FISHING FROM BRIDGES PROHIBITED. BY RENAMING THIS SECTION TO READ “PROHIBITED FISHING ACTIVITIES”; AND BY PROHIBITING CERTAIN HAZARDOUS FISHING PRACTICES FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE PUBLIC WELFARE; PROVIDING THAT ALL OTHER SECTIONS AND SUBSECTIONS OF CHAPTER 155. BEACHES AND WATERWAYS. WILL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT AS PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND AUTHORITY TO CODIFY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**Part I. Summary of the proposed ordinance and statement of public purpose:** Ordinance 405 adopts regulations to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by prohibiting certain hazardous activities related to fishing; and specifically restricts location where fishing can occur, and prohibits any fishing activity that may endanger the safety of nearby beachgoers, swimmers, or boaters.

**Part II. Estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the Town of Manalapan:**
